

Petrol Drive Off Factsheet



Call Triple Zero (000) if:

- The incident is happening now.
- The suspect is still at the scene.
- Anyone is seriously injured or in immediate danger.

Only use this form to report a petrol drive off which occurred within the Australian Capital Territory, Australia.

The ability to report your petrol drive off online to police complements existing reporting methods providing you with more choice and convenience.

What can be reported

Use this form to report non-urgent petrol drive off incidents that have occurred within the Australian Capital Territory, Australia. To be considered a police matter a person must dishonestly appropriate property belonging to someone else with the intention to permanently deprive.

What you need

- The petrol drive off report must be completed in English.
- A valid and current person or business email address and business phone number.
- Authorisation to report the incident on behalf of a business.

What to expect

ACT Policing will provide a response to the nominated email address within two days of making the report. Following an assessment of the report, including the nature of the alleged crime, gravity/sensitivity of the matter, and the extent of the alleged criminality, the response will advise if the report has been accepted/not progressed, or if further information is required.

If the report has been accepted, an ACT Policing reference number will be provided, which should be kept for use when contacting police in relation to this incident. If accepted and further investigation is required an investigation into your report will only commence once the available evidence is provided to Police, in person at the nearest Police station to where the offence occurred.

Attendance at Police station to provide evidence

Please ensure the console operator on duty at the time of the offence attends the nearest police station to where the offence occurred within seven days.

The console operator should have all relevant CCTV footage, and/or other relevant imagery with them when they attend the police station.

The console operator will be required to provide a statement to police at the front office for evidentiary purposes and must be willing to attend Court and give evidence.

If the console operator does not attend the police station and provide the material required, or is not prepared to give evidence in Court, no further action will be taken by police. Your report will remain on file for future reference if required.
